

## Case Study “Tourism in the Mornington Peninsula”

### Activity Sheet 2 “The characteristics of tourists in the Mornington Peninsula”

#### Introduction

Activity Sheet 2 requires students to analyse statistics to develop an understanding of the nature of tourism and the characteristics of tourists visiting the Mornington Peninsula.

The content of this activity sheet relates to the following Key Knowledge and Skills.

#### Key Knowledge - Area of Study 1

- The characteristics of domestic and international tourism.
- The changing characteristics of tourism over time.
- Factors affecting the different types of tourism at selected locations.

#### Key Skills

- Analyse maps, data and other geographic information to develop descriptions and explanations.
- Collect, sort, process and represent data and other information.
- Interpret and analyse maps and other geographical information.
- Identify the characteristics of tourism.
- Describe and explain the factors affecting the different types of tourism.

#### Origin of visitors to the Mornington Peninsula

1. According to the Mornington Peninsula Regional Tourism Summary, for the period ending March 2018 the Mornington Peninsula had over 7.3 million domestic (overnight and daytrip) and international overnight visitors. Of these 1.7 million were domestic overnight visitors, 5.6 million were domestic day trip visitors whilst 60,000 were overseas visitors.

- a. Create a pi - chart showing the above data. Ensure that this graph has the appropriate geographic conventions.
- b. Suggest reasons that could account for the above trends.

According to this document in 2014, 83% of visitors to the Mornington Peninsula came from Victoria, whilst 14% were from interstate and 3% were from international sources. One could assume that due to proximity a high percentage of Victorian visitors came from Melbourne and surrounds.

- Domestic Overnight Visitors
- Overseas Visitors

For each of the above categories describe the trends shown. Suggest reasons that may account for these trends (eg the declining value of the Australian dollar may help to explain the rise in domestic visitors for 2018).
